Dear Participant,

On this blustery winter day in Cameron County, I thought I would give you some warm thoughts about the canoe/kayak race set for April 10. I know it is a change of date, but it is necessary due to PA Fish and Boat moving the opening day of Trout Season. Last year the race was canceled due to Covid-19 restrictions, but organizers moving forward with the following Covid-19 mitigation guidelines.

1. No day of registrations and Covid-19 release form must be completed when picking up goodie bags.
2. No bus transportation from the finish to start line.
3. Awards will be given at the finish line.
4. \$10.00 vouchers will be given to each competitor. There is no expiration, and they can be used to purchase food, or other items at more than 30 locations in the region.
5. The entire event is limited to 200 paddlers.

This is the first leg of a trio of events. If a competitor completes the April race, 55 mile Sinnemahone Gravel Race in September and the 50k Sinnemahone Trail Run in October, they will be awarded the Triple Crown (individual). A group of three competitors can each take a leg of the race and earn the Triple Crown (team).

The course for the Sinnemahone Paddle is the same with a start time of 11 am across from the Emporium Country Club. Separate staging areas will be roped off to comply with social distancing. The finish line is in Driftwood.

This year when you register you will receive an event membership to ACA. This is required by ACA to provide insurance for the event. You will also be asked to sign a waiver.

PA Fish and Boat Commission and emergency responders have set safe water flows which are: 325cfu low and 2750cfu high. If the water does not meet the criteria 48 hours prior to the race it will be canceled.
